

## Alumni Leadership Day 2022

Speakers, mostly Alumni of LvBS shared their own crisis management and resilience cases during panel discussions. They focused on how war has influenced their businesses, their teams, and what is expected of the leaders in Ukraine today and will be expected in the future during Recovery of Ukraine.

### "Service and Devotion. How Leader Character helps to find energy, balance, and inspiration?"

In circumstances of war, the main ability is to identify the problem and be able to find resources that will solve it, in most cases helping other people.

### "Business resilience. The role of the leader in the sustainability of the company during the war"

War became a huge test for many businesses in Ukraine and though many companies are still in survival mode they look for opportunities for their development and growth in the future .



## Alumni Leadership Day 2022. Speakers

During his online speech Gerard Seijts expressed support and reminded participants about the importance of personal wellbeing during difficult times and how Leader Character can help to resist difficult circumstances



Since the beginning of the full-scale war, Roman Kazanko's business has suffered significant damage. Despite the great risks, he remained in Kyiv and continued to work.

"At the beginning of the war, we made a decision that in case of the occupation, we would not work for Russians. If we speak pragmatically, the loss was not an option. If the region was captured, business would die. It was an "everything or nothing" bet. It helps to make the right decisions and to get rid of doubts.



## Scientific research conducted by the Center for Leadership of UCU

### The 2nd wave of the research "Leader character moderates the negative relation between leadership context hostility and leader subjective wellbeing".



Goal: to gather 200 additional respondents (100 civilians and 100 military personnel) to examine whether the war (in this case, a natural experiment) has influenced the previous findings.



What has been done: the fieldwork has already commenced

### The experiment on Interactive effects of senior leaders' character dimensions on bribing behaviors and its relation to managerial derailing



**Goal:** to increase the sample size by 120 respondents

## A documentary-methodological film


The film is uncovering various virtues in each of the heroes from the early days of the Russo-Ukrainian war.



## LEADERSHIP & VOLUNTEERING LABORATORY; SMALL GRANTS PROGRAM



The "Volunteering Laboratory" was launched in 2019. It is a platform where students can develop their Leader Character through volunteering. Its mission is to create opportunities for UCU students to gain leadership and professional skills by involving them in social service and social volunteering.

## The "Leadership in Volunteering" project

### The first UCU academic course on working with volunteers

- 12 people participated
- **3** participants became mentors in the UCU Service Program
- 3 participants became volunteer team leaders in "Building Ukraine Together" and "Regional Initiatives Foundation"
- Students improved their skills in working with volunteers

## Events that promote volunteering and recognize leaders in service

### An exhibition of volunteer projects

- Was aimed at helping the army and refugees during the full-scale invasion
- Showed diverse activities of the UCU community that took responsibility and leadership to do small projects, which contributed to the common victory



### **The "Mission Possible" event**

- The event inspires the community to serve and become leaders



• 58 students that had shown significant leadership engagement (became mentors, volunteers, and project coordinators) were awarded with certificates

## THE UCU SERVICE PROGRAM FOR FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

We create opportunities for self-improvement in serving others. At the same time, students can learn to be leaders in service. They face social challenges in todays Ukraine every day and participate in solving them at their level of competencies, and perhaps even implement their bravest plans to change the world for the better.

Students not only participated in volunteering but also created social, cultural, and educational events in local communities (organized a literary evening for youth, helped to restore a historical museum, conducted educational lessons for local schools or Easter workshops, etc.)







## THE UCU SERVICE PROGRAM. KEY METRICS



## Future plans

### Research

- In the summer of 2023, Andriv Rozhdestvensky & Gerard Seijts finalized the joint program between the Center for Leadership of UCU and Ivey Business School titled "Leadership in New Era", which is scheduled to commence in October 2023.
- To cooperate with Liz Stanley Professor from Georgetown University, veteran and author of meditation-based stress reduction method — in research on how character combined with mindfulness and stress reduction practices are influencing leaders' and their teams' well-being

### **Workshops**

To conduct Leadership and management workshops adding to the syllabuses organizational and personal resilience, subjective well-being topics.

### **Cooperation with the Army**

To certify our Leadership program with the General Staff and continue our cooperation with the Army. to start preparing leadership instructors among the military in order to scale Character Leadership in the Army












